Inspector General Releases Strategic Plan

The City of New Orleans Inspector General today released his plan for the next four years. The Office of Inspector General (OIG) will audit NOPD overtime and evaluate police off-duty details, benchmark pension plan investment performance, evaluate the City's Safety & Permits and Code Enforcement operations, and audit sales tax payments.

The plan also calls for an audit of the Sewerage & Water Board collections and remittances to the City and an audit of the Orleans Parish School Board as well as audits of its construction projects. These are the first reviews of "independent" entities or what the IG calls the satellites of city government. The plan calls for the OIG to review all of the satellites eventually, many in the next four years.

Inspector General Ed Quatrevaux said, "The satellites of city government are public entities conducting public business, and they have the responsibility to be good stewards of the public trust. We will review their use of funds, governance, and the circumstances and rationale for their creation."
